AF Steering Group on FP Review



- * Mandate: discuss and shape the new operational framework of the FP Network
- Composition: Austria, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Kosovo* (observer)
- Chairing: Netherlands + EFSA
- Duration: The AFSG will carry-out its activities from February until July 2022
- Reporting: AF and FP plenaries in 2022 + written procedure as needed
- Working methodology: The AFSG is meeting at least twice per month (every 2 Mondays)

^{*}This designation is without prejudice to positions on status, and is in line with UNSCR 1244/1999 and the ICJ Opinion on the Kosovo declaration of independence.

ToR - Deliverables



- ❖ Deliverable 1: ToR of the AFSG to be drafted by the AFSG during February 2022 and shared with AF ahead of the 83rd Advisory Forum Meeting for endorsement during the Plenary;
- ❖ Deliverable 2: Draft FP operational framework for the FP network and outline of the agreement – to be prepared during Q2 2022 and presented to the 48th FP meeting (18-19 May 2022) and 84th AF meeting (8-9 June 2022);
- ❖ Deliverable 3: Final adoption of a new operational Framework for the FP Network (based on flexibility – to address MSs diversity and inclusivity, a model which does not leave anyone behind delivering benefits for all, through tailor-made solutions); and an outline of the future FP agreements -to be endorsed by the AF by end of July 2022.

Mission

National Focal Points act as **connecting hubs** between EFSA and their relevant national actors and actors of the EU/EEA Member States and observer countries. Within a changing and increasingly complex environment and to respond to the ambitions of the EU Green Deal, Focal Points address EFSA and national needs and priorities to contribute to a **cohesive food safety system** in Europe. In this regard, Focal Points use the opportunities brought by the **Transparency Regulation** in order to foster **partnerships**.

Goals

- FPs are recognised as connecting hubs between EFSA and national actors by MS authorities and through integration in EFSA processes.
- FPs evolve into well-established and sustainable functions with access to a wide range of capabilities and expertise across different national organisations.
- FPs **foster partnerships** with relevant organisations to ensure a more **cohesive** and **sustainable food safety system** in Europe.
- FPs support and facilitate risk assessment and risk communication processes within countries, between countries and with EFSA through knowledge exchange, scientific cooperation and capacity building.
