EU Pollinators Initiative

Adopted in 2018, COM(2018)395

- > 30 actions in three pillars:
 - Improving knowledge;
 - Tackling causes of decline;
 - > Engaging stakeholders.

Long-term perspective (2030)

Public consultation 2018 > 66 000 replies

Alarming situation > 90%







Tackling the causes

Directly addressed: land use (change), agriculture, **pesticides**, invasive alien species

Indirectly: other pollutants, climate change

Habitats Directive EU common agricultural policy EU regonal policy **EU pesticide legislation** IAS Regulation



Actions on pesticides

Authorisation of pesticides

Sustainable use of pesticides (revision)

Need to improve:

- > Knowledge;
- Engagement of environmental authorities &
- Collaboration with agricultural authorities;
- Stakeholder engagement, including academia.



Preparatory Action EUR 5 M (EP)

Scope: All EU countries

Timeline: 2022-2023

Scope: All EU countries (~3.000 sites)
