MANDATE AND TOR

Regulation (EU) 1107/2009

Requires a high level of protection of humans and the environment.

Article 53

"...in special circumstances a Member State may authorise, for a period not exceeding 120 days, the placing on the market of plant protection products for limited and controlled use, where such a measure appears necessary because of a danger which cannot be controlled by any other reasonable means."



MANDATE AND TOR

Develop fit-for-purpose protocols to assess emergency authorisations granted under Article 53 in light of the objectives put forward in the Farm to Fork and Biodiversity Strategies.

- Insecticides and acaricides by May 2025
- Fungicides and bactericides by March 2026
- Remaining functions of active substances by January 2027



MANDATE AND TOR

The Farm to Fork and Biodiversity Strategies

- Improving the condition and diversity of agroecosystems.
- Accelerate the transition to a sustainable food system
- Reduce the use and risk from chemical pesticides



IMPLICATIONS FOR THE PROTOCOL DEVELOPMENT

- 1. Put special focus on non-chemical methods their combinations.
- 2. Avoid repeated authorization for the same pest/crop combination.
- 3. Justify the absence of reasonable alternative methods.
- 4. Harmonisation with measures applied in other MSs.



Preparatory work

- Analysis of existing emergency authorisations
- Data collection on alternatives to pesticides use including research projects
- Evaluation of alternatives as single measure and in combination



Emergency authorisations in the EU (2016-2023): 4756



Evaluation criteria for alternative methods:



Consultations will take place on the following topics:

- Availability of "reasonable" alternatives
- Criteria to evaluate alternative measures single and combinations of measures duration of measures comparability of agri-environments
- Issues with existing protocols developed for derogations to control a serious danger to plant health (article 4(7) of Regulation 1107)
