**Call title:** NAMS4NANO: Integration of New Approach Methodologies results in chemical risk assessments: Case studies addressing nanoscale considerations.

**Question:**

- 1) Since UK entities can't be partners, can they be subcontractors? and is there a definition of the limit in the rules as to what ancillary and assistance tasks consist of (see p20 'Subcontracting only covers the implementation of a limited part of the action' and 'Only ancillary and assistance tasks can be subcontracted.')
- 2) If expertise from the UK organisations can be seconded to partner organisations, and if so can they still be based in the UK when doing the work?

**Answer:**

- 1) For this project, UK entities can be subcontractors. Core tasks, such as project coordination, cannot be subcontracted. Only ancillary and assistance tasks can be subcontracted.
- 2) UK subcontractors can be based in UK for the execution of the tasks requested, there is not obligation to be seconded to the partner organisations
