### **EFSA Public Consultation - Specific Privacy Statement**

# Title: Public Consultation on the draft Guidance on Communication of Uncertainty in Scientific Assessments

#### 1. Objective

The objective of this public consultation is to receive the views of stakeholders or people concerned by the topic of the public consultation and to publish them on the EFSA website, under the responsibility of the Head of the SCER Unit (Scientific Committee and Emerging Risks), acting as the Controller. As the public consultation process implies the collection and limited further processing of certain personal data, Regulation (EC) 45/2001, of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data, is applicable.

## 2. What personal information do we collect and through which technical means?

#### **Identification Data**

The personal data collected and further processed are data necessary for the participation in the public consultation, such as Name, Surname, Affiliation, Country, email, including the contribution on the topic concerned. The processing of personal data linked to the organisation and management of this public consultation is necessary for the management and functioning of EFSA, as mandated by EFSA's Founding Regulation<sup>1</sup>.

#### **Technical information**

The public consultation is carried out via the European Commission's official survey management tool 'EUSurvey'. The reference installation of the tool is hosted at DG DIGIT of the European Commission and survey contributions are collected in the DG DIGIT datacentre. After the closure of the survey, an EFSA staff member in charge downloads in a secure manner the data file with the survey replies into EFSA's Document Management System with a restricted access setting on a need-to know-basis. #### 3. Publication of contributions

Survey contributions will be published and may be re-used by EFSA in a different context. It should be noted that comments submitted by individuals in a personal capacity will be presented as such, be made publicly accessible and attributed to their

author, indicated by their name and surname. Comments submitted on behalf of an organisation will be made publicly available and attributed to the organisation.

Comments should *inter alia* be copyright cleared taking into account EFSA's transparency policy and practise to publish all submissions.
