#### THE 2016 EUROPEAN WEEK OF BEES AND POLLINATION

Since 2012, the European Week of Bees and Pollinators takes place annually in the European Parliament offering the opportunity for representatives of the European institutions, national institutions, the beekeeping sector, farmers, animal health specialists, NGOs, scientists, and industry from fields related to bees and biodiversity to meet to exchange views, discuss the current challenges and formulate recommendations to be addressed to policy makers.

The European Week of Bees and Pollinators aims at highlighting the vital role of pollination with regards to food security, nutrition, ecosystem services and biodiversity conservation, and to bring these topics doser to European citizens.

Bees and pollinators provide invaluable services for Europeans, but the question still remains: what are Europeans doing for bees? Taking stock of the latest elements of European research, such as the EPSA Statistical analysis on the EPLOBEE dataset and the IUCN European Red List of Bees, this high-level conference will draw attention to the needs and challenges for European policies on how to protect pollinators. The panels will also open up the discussion on issues such as the development of animal health solutions, beekeeping practices, the sustainable use of pesticides, the labelling of and traceability of hive products, and the evaluation of the new Common Agricultural Policy.

#### THE 2017 BURDPEAN WEEK OF BEES AND POLLINATION

Since 2012, the European Bee and Pollination Week is held every year in the European Parliament in Brussels. This meeting has become a must-attend event and brings together all stakeholders in the sector: European MPs, representatives of the Commission and European institutions, beekeepers, farmers, scientists, veterinarians, manufacturers, NGOs and citizens. Together, they exchange proposals with public authorities to promote a sustainable beekeeping chain capable of ensuring the sustainability of the valuable service of pollination and its consequences: ecosystem services, blodiversity, production and food security.

After recalling the original multifactorial approach of bee mortality observed throughout the world, after stressing the need for better collaboration between stakeholders through dialogue and mutual respect, the stak eholders historically involved in the European Bee and Pollination Week have called for the establishment of an operational technical platform to improve ex changes between beekeepers and scientists. This edition is marked by the willingness and commitment of EFSA to set up this platform. The first working groups to define the outlines and the priority needs will be held during this 6 th edition of the Bee Week.

This year, the beekeepers of the Mediterranean basin will contribute to enrich our discussions and to draw the outlines of the new operations around the beekeeping chain.





























Finally, on the recommendations of the last scientific symposium, the stakeholders historically involved in the European Bee and Pollination Week have called for the establishment of an operational technical platform to improve exchanges between stakeholders.

This edition 2017 is marked by the willingness and commitment of EFSA to set up this platform.
