



CONNECTING ONGOING INITIATIVES

- Beekeepers submitting data once
 - not more data
 - but harmonise data reporting



- Better sharing of data amongst stakeholders
 - discuss the limitations
 - search for drivers to establish WIN-WIN situation
- Connect to non-bee data (e.g. weather, land use)


But how to integrate the obtained data to describe bee health status?





HEALTH STATUS INDEX (HSI)

Integration of data on indicators and factors



 Adapt index based on what should be monitored (e.g. honey production, pollination)





HEALTH STATUS INDEX (HSI)

- Output at different levels:
 - individual colony
 - apiary
 - regional
 - national
 - EU

Aggregation of data at required level

 Monitoring and comparision of bee health over time and across geographical space


STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT ON SUSTAINABLE VOLUNTARY DATA COLLECTION AND SHARING

- Sustainable: unlikely to find long term resources
- Voluntary: there should be a benefit for everybody involved
- Sharing: improve return upon investment
