STAKEHOLDER GROUP ON FRAMING OF QUESTIONS

Background;

 this engagement model responds to one of the measures identified under the EFSA Transparency and Engagement (TERA) project with aim to improve the transparency and openness of EFSA core business

Objectives;

 to allow EFSA to capture societal needs and expectations at an early stage of the development of EFSA's self-mandate and guidance documents, i.e. framing of mandates, in particular those which are sensitive or technically complex.



EFSA ONGOING INITIATIVES

Initiatives to allow early engagement with stakeholders

- testing of PROMETHEUS approach with topics such as BPA, Sodium and Sugar,
- Expert Knowledge Elicitation with involvement of social scientists,
- Frontloading activities,
- TERA measures
 - updated <u>Guidelines on EFSA Consultations</u> published in March 2018 – reference to the Stakeholder Group for Framing of Questions as a new initiative of stakeholder engagement
- Discussion Group on Bee Partnership for collecting and sharing of data



Discussion Group on Bee Partnership

Background

- absence of harmonised data across the EU to help inform policy makers on what is causing increasing bee fatalities – conclusion of the European Parliament's Week of Bees and Pollination 2016,
- European Parliament tasked EFSA to organise bee health symposium as part of Bee Week 2017 – <u>link to the report</u>
- EFSA co-organised the Bee Week 2017 symposium with **key stakeholders** (EPBA, BeeLife, ECPA, COPA-COGECA and involvement of NGOs PAN-Europe)
- EFSA pledged to facilitate the next steps by organising a discussion group to agree the terms of reference for the partnership.



Discussion Group on Bee Partnership

- The group is composed of EU-wide stakeholder organisations representing beekeepers, agro-food industry, food trade, farmers, academia, and NGOs,
- three meetings of the Bee Discussion Group in Brussels facilitated by EFSA

Next steps

- The group will prepare a terms of references for the Partnership and present it at the annual High-Level Conference at the European Week of Bees and Pollination in June 2018.
- Fitness-check, regular meeting of the Discussion Group - facilitated by EFSA





Discussion Group on Bee Partnership

- a model for early engagement with stakeholders on framing of data collection and sharing,
- Discussion Groups "learning systems" that allow EFSA to <u>capitalise</u> on <u>stakeholders' specialist</u> knowledge,
- provides stakeholders with information about different aspects of the Authority's work,
- direct benefits for stakeholders; creation of synergies, facilitation of data sharing and access, and ultimately increased evidence and best practice on bee health.





Possible Future initiatives

Future initiatives to allow early engagement with stakeholders

- ongoing internal consultations on how to streamline the initial phase of the scientific assessment processes through increased stakeholder engagement - mapping of projects that are at envisioning phase, i.e. before a scoping paper or charter is created.
- the EFSA's Scientific Committee work programme "Priority topics for the development of cross-cutting risk assessment guidance" - opportunity to integrate the ambitions of stakeholder engagement into this process
