# Stakeholder Engagement 3rd Meeting of the EFSA Stakeholder Bureau

**Brussels, 17 October 2018** 

#### Introduction

The Stakeholder Bureau is one of two permanent mechanisms under EFSA's Stakeholder Engagement Approach (SEA). It is made up of seven members representing different stakeholder categories, namely the consumer and environment NGOs, food industry and business, farmer organisations, distributors, practitioners and academia. Their role is to advise EFSA on civil society's concerns regarding food safety, health, the environment, risk communication and other issues in the Authority's remit. Members of the Bureau act in the interests of the whole stakeholder category that they represent.

The task of the Bureau is also to contribute to the general understanding of EFSA's scientific risk assessment process among stakeholders, thereby enhancing the trustworthiness of decisions taken. It helps to shape the agenda of the Stakeholder Forum, the annual gathering of all registered stakeholder organisations.

The previous meeting of EFSA's Stakeholder Bureau<sup>1</sup> took place on 18 April 2018 in Brussels. The Bureau discussed progress with the implementation of the SEA, the priorities for the Stakeholder Forum in 2018, as well as stakeholder engagement in the framing of EFSA self-mandates and guidance documents. EFSA representatives presented upcoming communication activities and the results of the reputation barometer 2017. European Commission members from DG SANTE presented the main elements of the proposal for a regulation on the transparency and sustainability of risk assessment in the food chain<sup>2</sup>.

#### The third meeting of the Stakeholder Bureau

The third meeting of the Stakeholder Bureau took place in Brussels on 17 October 2018. It was chaired by EFSA's Executive Director, Bernhard Url. Delegates were welcomed by the Chair of EFSA's Management Board, Jaana Husu-Kallio.

The agenda of the meeting was co-created with the Bureau members and designed with a view to allow space for interaction and questions.

#### **Discussion Points**

Péter Bokor, Head of DG SANTE's Food Chain Science and Stakeholder Relations Unit, provided an update on the progress with the legislative proposal on transparency and sustainability of risk assessment in the food chain.

Dr Url expressed his concerns about the European Parliament's position that more time is needed at the Parliament level to process the proposal.

Bureau members expressed worries that the proposed budget increase to support EFSA's work could be lost if the proposal were put on hold.

Ms Husu-Kallio presented the recommendations made by the Management Board further to their meeting of 10 October 2018 on the basis of EFSA's external evaluation. She stressed the importance of cooperation with the Member States, international organisations and stakeholders.

The Bureau discussed the goals and practicalities of the Stakeholder Forum scheduled to take place in Brussels on 20 November 2018. Members agreed on the distribution of tasks and agreed on their roles of chairs/facilitators for the workshops.

Barbara Gallani, Head of EFSA's Communication, Engagement and Cooperation Department, presented the Authority's latest communication activities and upcoming public consultations. Ms Gallani also updated the Bureau on the Communicators Lab, the application of digital communication tools and the latest user figures for the EFSA Journal. She said that positive experiences gained from the piloting of digital collaboration tools could be applied to stakeholder engagement.

The Bureau then discussed a number of topics, such as take-home messages from the EFSA scientific conference 2018 (submitted by the Industry category); follow-up on the external evaluation of EFSA (submitted by the Industry Category); EFSA's opinion on the presence of dioxins (PCDD/Fs) in feed and food (submitted by the Consumer category); risk perception among the general public and EFSA's work to inform and educate consumers on risk assessment in food safety (submitted by the Industry category); and on the independence of science (submitted by the Academia category).

The Bureau agreed to continue with the half-day, biannual format to meet.

A call for nominations of stakeholder representatives as alternate members of the Bureau will be launched in the coming weeks.

#### **General remarks and next steps**

Ms Husu-Kallio acknowledged the work of the Bureau and reminded members that the Stakeholder Forum meeting on 20 November would be an additional opportunity for EFSA's registered stakeholders to provide input to the mid-term review of EFSA's Strategy 2020. She also invited the Bureau to contribute to the Stakeholder Forum's discussions and help to set priorities for the EFSA Strategy 2027.

Dr Url thanked the Bureau members for their active participation, adding that EFSA will continue to exchange information with them and was looking forward to more interaction over the coming months. He closed the meeting by saying that "together, we can go further by doing our bit for the overall European project and bring Europe's food safety system ever closer to the citizen".

The next meeting of the Stakeholder Bureau may take place in April 2019 (date tbc).
