

Transparent - Dol Schema






Collecting interests



Appointment process of members of Scientific Committee, Panel or working group



Submission of ADoIs



As a first point on the agenda of each meeting



Responsibility of declaring rests with concerned individual

Dols cover a five year time span



Horizontal exclusion criteria

- No expert working with industry on which EFSA outputs impact will be allowed on Scientific Committee, Panels and working groups (ADol) (addressing comments)
- No expert will be ever allowed to review or assess his or her own work (addressing comments)

Deciding on declared interests



- Definition of Conflict of Interest (addressing comments)
- Tables laying down allowable interests (Annexes IV and V)
- Stricter approach for Chairmanship
- **Simpler** scheme of preventive measures (in or out)
- More inclusive scheme for experts with interests in Food Safety Organisations (organisations in the Art. 36 list and other entities, carrying out tasks within EFSA's mission, pursuing public interest objectives and whose governance ensures the performance of its tasks with independence and integrity) (addressing comments)


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The members:

- Undertake to act independently in the public interest
- Make a declaration of commitment
- Are subject to ADols and ODols
- Have voluntarily adopted and subscribed to the Code of conduct of the Management Board (2011)
- However, are also subject to a particular nomination procedure and role

Management Board/Advisory Forum- Dol screening







When employed by EFSA

- Article 11a SR applicable to all staff and Executive Director
- ADol obligation for knowledge workers
- Screening
- Assignment of tasks and dossiers where no Col exists

Staff - II



When staff intend leaving EFSA

- Obligation to declare negotiations with prospective employers with ensuing screening
- Declaration of Honour to be signed by all staff leaving EFSA
- Detailed form on obligations of Art. 16 SR, to be duly signed by all staff leaving EFSA
- Decision of the Executive Director on possible limitations

Networks & networking meetings



- Subject to ADol and ODols
- Same principles for screening applicable to scientific experts
- Appointment exclusive responsibility of Member State
- Possibility of triggering reaction from appointing Member State in case of Col

Procurement and grants



- Mandatory institutional Dols for tenderers
- Individual Dols for team members of contractors or grant beneficiaries for calls on sensitive matters
- Same principles on screening and ensuing measures applicable to EFSA scientific experts


