## 4. Discussions

The WG discussed the terms of reference and in particular the scope of the opinion. The objective of the Zoonosis data collection and analysis is to ensure that zoonoses, zoonotic agents and related antimicrobial resistance are properly monitored, that food-borne outbreaks receive proper epidemiological investigation and to enable the collection in the Community of the information necessary to evaluate relevant trends and sources (Directive 2003/99). The data collected, together with data from other sources, should form the basis for risk assessment of zoonotic organisms but the WG agreed that this is not the main objective of this mandate. The WG has decided to address each term of reference for each of the diseases/zoonotic organisms already contemplated in the first opinion: Brucella, Q



fever, Tuberculosis, Rabies, Echinococcus, Cysticerci, Francisella and Leptospira. Additional sections of the opinion will address other zoonoses or zoonotic agents to be considered in future data collections and specific requirements for RA from AHAW. The Art 36 AHAW 2010-01 will be considered as a source of background information for the draft. The WG agreed on a table of contents, tasks and a plan for future meetings and its objectives. However due to the need to appoint a new chair and confirm the WG composition dates are yet to be confirmed.
