The WG chair informed the WG about the feedback from the panel on the progress of the draft opinion. The WG then went through the draft opinion addressing the remaining comments in the documents and update on the contribution since the last meeting.

The afternoon of the first day and morning of the second day were dedicated to the expert knowledge elicitation on the uncertainty about effectiveness of control options. In a first step, the experts were asked to provide a judgement on the effectiveness of a control option to reduce human campylobacteriosis by >10%. In a second step, those interventions hat were expected to have such an effect, were discussed in more detail. From that process resulted a ranking of control options based on their estimated effectiveness and the uncertainty around that estimate.

The remainder of the second day was focussing on how the ranking should be described in the draft opinion, followed by a discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of control option and how to address effects of combined control options, as requested in the terms of reference.

A first set of conclusions and recommendations was drafted.

The outcome of the expert knowledge elicitation and the updated draft opinion will be presented to the BIOHAZ Panel on 11/12 December 2019.

The WG then discussed questions relating to the modelling of the effect of intervention as that aim at reducing the concentration of Campylobacter in the caeca of broilers. The WG then decided on which interventions will be included in the model. This was followed by a discussion on the contributions the draft opinions and task were assigned.

The second part of the meeting was dedicated to the discussion on uncertainty analysis. The hearing experts provided advice on the preparatory tasks for the expert knowledge elicitation (EKE) in November. The evidence tables for the interventions and the uncertainty table for the overall uncertainty have been completed. In preparation to the EKE, the experts will pre-screen the interventions in relation to uncertainty to inform the actual EKE which will be used to provide a probability judgement and ranking of interventions.

The outcome of both approaches will be expressed as relative risk reductions. Effect of control options that cannot be quantified will be expressed qualitatively. The ranking will be done based on effectiveness including the uncertainty.

During the second day, discussions focussed on uncertainty analysis. The Hearing expert provided advice on how the WG could implement the EFSA Scientific Committee's Guidance on Uncertainty Analysis in Scientific Assessments. An approach on how to assess uncertainty about the effectiveness of control measures was agreed and the questions and preparatory tasks for an expert knowledge elicitation were identified.

The discussions during the first part of the meeting focussed on the methodology to be applied to estimate the effect of interventions targeting a reduction of *Campylobacter* prevalence in broiler flocks and a reduction of *Campylobacter* concentration in broiler caecal content. A quantitative approach will be followed as far as possible using population-attributable fractions (PAF) for the prevalence-based interventions. The results of the literature search were discussed and a list of risk factors and related control options to be taken further was agreed. The approach for assessing the effect of measures targeting concentrations of Campylobacter in caecal contents of broilers was discussed and agreed.

The contributions to the draft opinion were presented and comments from the WG and BIOHAZ panel were addressed.

The WG suggested approaches for uncertainty analysis and with support of the hearing experts the next steps were agreed. Uncertainties will be described per risk factor/control measure. A simplified table suggested in the last meeting, will be modified in this regard.

Tasks were distributed and deadlines agreed.

The discussions during this meeting focussed on the methodology to be applied to estimate the effect of interventions targeting a reduction of *Campylobacter* prevalence in broiler flocks and a reduction of *Campylobacter* concentration in broiler caecal content. A quantitative approach will be followed as far as possible using population-attributable fractions for the prevalence-based interventions and consumer-phase model and dose-response model for the concentration-based interventions.

The Hearing experts provided advice on how the WG could implement the EFSA Scientific Committee's Guidance on Uncertainty Analysis in Scientific Assessments. A simplified table was suggested to record uncertainties related to data, publications and models used.

### 5. Scientific topic(s) for discussion

# **5.1.** Scientific opinion on Update and review of control options for Campylobacter in broilers at primary production<sup>7</sup>

The WG chair introduced the mandate to the WG including a short presentation of the scientific opinion on *Campylobacter* control options in broiler meat published in 2011. The current mandate requires and update and review of that opinion focussing only on control options in primary production. A timeline for WG meetings in 2019 was suggested.

This was followed by a presentation of available mathematical models to assess the effect of control options including those used in the 2011 opinion. In addition, results from the CAMCON project in relation to onfarm interventions were presented.

An approach to answering the terms of reference was discussed which includes a literature review including publications from 2010-2019 and a modelling approach for measures affecting flock prevalence and the concentration of *Campylobacter* in the intestines of broilers.

The EFSA Scientific Committee's Guidance on Uncertainty Analysis in Scientific Assessments<sup>8</sup> was introduced and the WG agreed on an approach on how to apply the principles of this guidance to the draft opinion.
