Declarations of Interest³, EFSA screened the Annual Declaration of Interest and the Specific Declaration of Interest filled in by the working group members invited for the present meeting. No Conflicts of Interest related to the issues discussed in this meeting have been identified during the screening process or at the Oral Declaration of Interest at the beginning of this meeting.

4. Scientific topic(s) for discussion4

WG members informed of the latest cases of CWD confirmed in Norway and on the ongoing experimental challenges of cases in transgenic mice and bank voles in the USA and Italy, respectively. The Chair provided feedback from the BIOHAZ Panel, following the thorough reading of the draft scientific opinion in the previous plenary meeting. The feedback was very positive with minor suggestions provided by the two internal reviewers. The WG reviewed the current contents of the sections "Answers to the Terms of Reference (ToRs)" and "Recommendations". A list of standing comments in the current draft was reviewed and some changes in the body of the text were agreed. Equally, the data included in the Appendices were reviewed.

5. Work plan: tasks and deadlines

Actions and deadlines were agreed during the revision of the sections of the current draft. This was the last WG meeting. It was agreed that there was no need to have any extraordinary WG meeting. A timetable was agreed to have the final draft of the scientific opinion ready for submission to the BIOHAZ panel for possible adoption on 6-7 December 2017.

The Chair welcomed the participants. No apologies were received.

4. Scientific topic(s) for discussion

The Chair provided feedback from the BIOHAZ panel, following the first reading of the draft scientific opinion in the previous plenary meeting, and of the follow-up of the collaboration with the TSE EURL, after the participation of its representative as hearing expert in the previous WG meeting. The WG reviewed the current contents and layout of the draft scientific opinion. The conclusions and recommendations of the 2004 and 2010 EFSA opinions, subject of the two Terms of Reference (ToR), are included in the current draft and all of them are commented, updated and/or qualified following the conclusions of the assessment, thoroughly elaborated in the corresponding section. Available data on performance of diagnostic tests for CWD were reviewed. Decisions were made on the need to seek for additional data from manufacturers and literature to complement the answer to ToR4. Surveillance data provided by Norway will be also analysed to estimate disease frequency in order to compare with similar data or new incursions of CWD in North America.

5. Work plan: tasks and deadlines

Actions and deadlines were agreed during the revision of the sections of the current draft. The next WG meeting will take place on 30 October 2017, as a web-conference.

1. Welcome and apologies for absence

The Chair welcomed the members of the working group (WG), the representative of the TSE EURL, and EFSA staff as observer. No apologies were received.

2. Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted without changes.

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3. Declarations of Interest of Working Groups members

In accordance with EFSA's Policy on Independence and Scientific Decision-Making Processes² and the Decision of the Executive Director on Declarations of Interest^{3,} EFSA screened the Annual Declaration of Interest and the Specific Declaration of Interest filled in by the working group members invited for the present meeting. No Conflicts of Interest related to the issues discussed in this meeting have been identified during the screening process or at the Oral Declaration of Interest at the beginning of this meeting.

4. Scientific topic(s) for discussion

The EC encouraged and recommended the collaboration of the TSE EURL and EFSA on their particular tasks regarding CWD diagnostics. The hearing expert and representative of the TSE EURL Claire Cassar, explained that the TSE EURL has been commissioned by the EC to produce guidelines of the tests to be used by MS for testing cervid samples within the scope of the newly-enforced CWD surveillance programme.

Sylvie Benestad presented an update of the situation of CWD in Norway, and details of the latest case reported (6th). The WG discussed profusely all aspects affecting the performance of rapid tests for the detection of CWD in cervids. Available data from manufacturers of rapid tests and scientific literature were critically reviewed. A long list of uncertainties underpinning the CWD diagnosis using rapid and confirmatory tests were highlighted and discussed. All these aspects will be articulated in the opinion as background information. The design implementation of the 2006-2010 surveillance system were critically reviewed. The conclusions of the 2004 and 2010 EFSA opinions were reviewed and most of them are still valid but need to be put into the context of the current knowledge and disease status in Europe.

5. Work plan: tasks and deadlines

Actions and deadlines were agreed during the revision of the sections drafted during the discussion. The Chair explained the WG of the suggestion by EFSA management to replace the remaining physical meeting by another web-conference due to budgetary constraints. It was agreed to fix the next web-conference on Thursday 14 September 2017

The approaches to be followed in order to address the two Terms of Reference (ToR) were brainstormed and possible topics to be elaborated during the assessment were listed as headings for the scientific opinion. They include: the evaluation of performance of diagnostic tests, the available diagnostic methods for CWD and the factors potentially affecting diagnostics for Tor4; the new surveillance data on CWD in Europe since 2010 and the description of the occurrence of CWD in new areas for ToR5. The conclusions and recommendations of the 2004 and 2010 EFSA opinions mentioned in the ToRs were reviewed.

5. Work plan: tasks and deadlines

Actions and deadlines were agreed during the revision of the sections drafted during the brainstorming session. The next WG meeting will take place on 21 July, as a physical meeting in Parma.
