- The WG reviewed and discussed the data about Ulmus sp distribution in the EU territory. Data availability is scarce. Considering that the only interceptions of S. tridentata were recorded in the port of Livorno (Italy), as a case study to be included in an annex of the pest categorization the WG is focused on Ulmus sp distribution in Northern Italy.

The WG discussed about the pest categorization of *Saperda tridentata* (St). The points of the discussion included:

- information on pest biology and preferred hosts is confirmed to be very limited. The new North American experts contacted so far confirmed that this pest is not studied as it is not considered important or of relevant impact.
- A literature search is ongoing on databases including very old documents (scientific and policy documents) from the end of 1800. Some interesting info was found and is under evaluation
- Regarding the possibility of developing a PRA after the pest categorization, the WG agreed that the only option will be to adopt the Tier 1 described in the EFSA Guidance on quantitative pest risk assessment, as Tier 2 (i.e. complex modelling) will be not possible considering the very little information available
- The WG is analysing the plasticity of the genus Saperda in relation to the host range. This analysis will be useful to make assumptions and to assess the expected host range of *S .tridentata* and potential host shift if preferred hosts are not available

8. Discussion on Saperda tridentata pest categorization

The WG discussed about the pest categorization of *Saperda tridentata* (St). The points of the discussion included:

- information on pest biology and preferred hosts is very limited. The literature search, the North American experts contacted so far, the other considered risk assessment (from Norway and Sweden) have not allowed to find clear evidences or useful information to determine if the EU elm species are in the host range of this pest
- In general most of the information comes from very old literature mainly based on observations rather than experiments
- Some studies indicate that the EU elm species are not susceptible. However all of them are old observational and not experimental studies
- The pest is not considered of primary importance in US so it's not studied anymore
- All the above elements make the uncertainty regarding several biological parameters and regarding the evaluation on the impact on EU elm species very high
- Drafting of the pest categorization is ongoing
- Considering the lack of information and the very high uncertainty on many aspects related to this pest, the wg decided to keep contacting and consulting other North American experts, and to continue to search for useful literature/data/information regarding the pest
- The WG discussed with BD and CR about the potential application of a quantitative pathway model for the *S. tridentata* PRA.

The WG discussed about the pest categorization of *Saperda tridentata* (St). The points of the discussion included:

- information on pest biology and preferred hosts is very limited. The WG agreed to look for and contact a Cerambycid expert in North America where St is a common elm-infesting Cerambycid
- other sources of information, including (e.g.) St or other Cerambycids pest risk assessment prepared by other institutions or organizations will be searched
- the use of a model for quantitative pathway analysis will be considered if enough data and information (or proxy for the specific case of St) will be available. The WG agreed to discuss in a dedicated meeting with the model developers about the characteristics of the model and data requirements
- a critical point for the evaluation of potential establishment is the availability of sensitive hosts in EU. Some observations from US seems to suggest that EU Ulmus sp. planted in US are not susceptible. However this information needs to be checked, re-discussed, and evaluated in the EU context. Also the presence of US species in the EU needs to be discussed.
- information on wood movements and exports from US to EU are generally related to classes of wood products and quantitative info on wood species is available on species different from *Ulmus* sp. WG agreed to look for expert in wood movement and exports from US.
- drafting of the pest categorization is ongoing and specific tasks for the WG members were discussed and a first draft will be finalized during the next WG meeting.

8. Discussion on the Mandate on the Scientific Opinion on Saperda tridentata

The meeting was aimed at discussing and clarifying the terms of reference of the Mandate on Saperda tridentata.

The following points were discussed:

- This is a full risk assessment including: (i) pest categorization, (ii) entry, (iii) spread, (iv) establishment, risk reduction options (v)
- As far as Entry, the mandate asks explicitly to pay particular attention to wood of *Ulmus*. Anyway, PM stressed that the PRA should not be limited to wood of Ulmus but should consider all entry pathways.
- The focus should be on the pest (*S. tridentata*), not on particular pest/host combinations.
